"Come and play with my wagon."

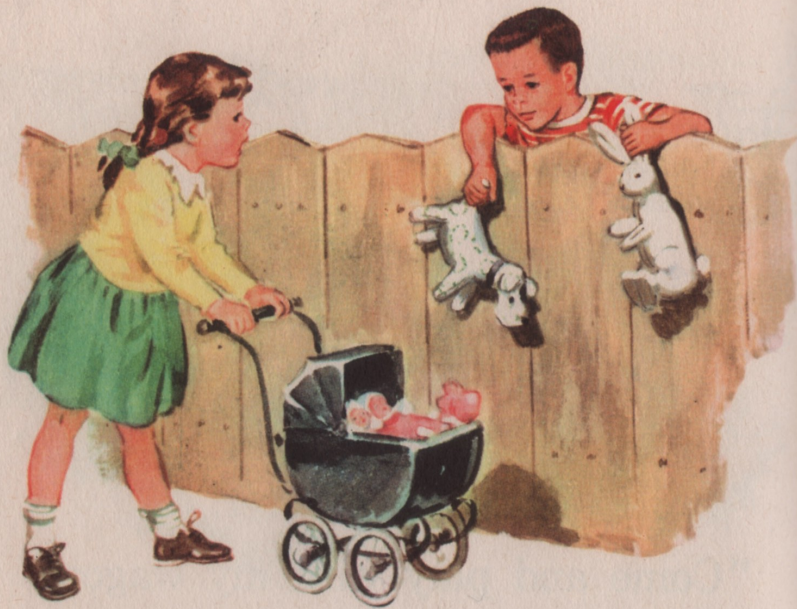
"I am too busy," said Tom.

"I am too busy now," said Tom.

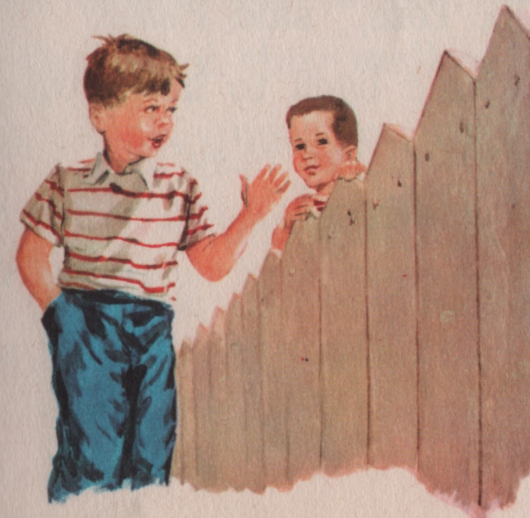
"Here are your old umbrella and
